



The Ministry of Silly Walks!

This game will bring out the silly in your group!
Do you just talk the talk or can you WALK the WALK?

Overview

- ★ # of Participants: Any number, can be **3 or even 50!**
- ★ Where to Play: **Indoors/Outdoors**
- ★ Age of Participants: **Elementary School / Middle School / High School**
- ★ Approximate Time to Play: **10 to 30 minutes**
- ★ Materials: **None**

Summary

- ★ Create two parallel lines, 10-30 ft apart
- ★ Designate a leader who will choose and announce a category
- ★ Players will move to the line by performing a silly walk that matches the category
- ★ The player with the silliest walk earns a point and becomes the next leader

How to Play

Use tape, cones, etc. to create two parallel lines about ten feet apart. Choose one player to be the leader and have all of the other players line up along one of the lines. The leader will stand at the other line, facing the other players. The goal for the players is to get to the line in front of them by creating the silliest, most ridiculous "walk" possible. The leader's job is to announce a category for the walks and to judge who came up with the best one.

The categories can be anything from "jumping" to "a day at the zoo" to "spicy ramen noodles". Encourage creativity! Once the leader announces the category, the players will have 10 seconds to think of their "walk" before they have to start moving. Once all players have crossed the line, the leader will choose the winner of the round, the person who had the best "walk". The winner receives one point and becomes the leader for the next round.

Establish how many points players need to win. For larger groups, we would suggest choosing a smaller number (e.g. 3-5), and vice versa for smaller groups. But it all comes down to how long you'd like your group to play!

Tips!

Come up with a couple funny categories before you show this game to your group. Then, you can lead the first couple rounds, giving some good examples to your group before they take over. The more creative the better!
