



Reverse Pictionary!

Who's really doing the drawing...

Overview

- ★ # of Participants: **6+ people**
- ★ Where to Play: **Indoors**
- ★ Age of Participants: **Middle / High School**
- ★ Approximate Time to Play: **15 to 30 minutes**
- ★ Materials: **Dry Erase Board and Marker** for each team (4-6 people)

Summary

- ★ Divide your group into teams of 4-6 people
- ★ Send one representative from each team out of earshot and tell the groups what they will draw
- ★ Have the team members hold the whiteboard and have the representatives hold the marker
- ★ The team needs to move the whiteboard around their guesser's marker to create the image
- ★ Whichever guesser figures it out first, gets a point!

How to Play

Divide the players into two teams, then wrap all of the participants with a ton of duct tape, sticky side out. You should wrap everyone from shoulder level to their knees, but if you want to make the game a little easier, you can wrap from shoulder to waist. The more surface area of exposed sticky tape the better, but just make sure to leave enough tape for everyone.

Spread a deck of cards in a wide area across the floor. Line your group up, countdown from three, and then watch the chaos ensue as everyone runs to pick up the cards with the tape. Players will run to the cards you spread out, lay down, and roll around to collect as many cards as they can. You can either set a time limit for the game or wait until all the cards have been picked up. At the end of the competition, each team will count how many cards they collected. Whichever team collected the most cards is the winner!

Tips!

Tell the players to be very careful when they are running because once you fall down, it is very hard to get back up!
